

Flat Racing (Turf) Trainer Research Report (sample)

Introduction

Flat Racing spans the whole year these days thanks to all weather racing, but the main turf season runs from the end of March to the beginning of November and this report focuses on turf flat racing over the past five seasons (2009 to 2013).

As with any forms of racing there have been angles that have proved profitable in the past and this report highlights several of them. Of course there are many more negative stats than positive ones, and these are noted also. The intention was to compile a comprehensive report which would enable the everyday punter to see at a glance the strengths and weaknesses of the main trainers in Flat racing. This report covers 50 of the top trainers and the trainers are listed by alphabetically for ease of reference.

For each trainer there are maximum of 30 different variables analysed – including such things as favourites, 2yo maiden races, Group Races, LTO winners to name but four. There are also additional trainer pointers with some key positive and negative stats that have not appeared in the main tables.

For the record SR stands for strike rate; ROI stands for return on investment. The profit/losses have been calculated to £1 level stakes at Starting Price.

Additional pointers:

- **0 wins from 47 at Ascot; 0 from 22 at Goodwood**
- **Small profit on horses priced 4/1 or shorter**
- **Horses upped 2 or more furlongs in trip have made good profits from a 21% SR**
- **Jockeys Gibbons, Makin and Spence have all proved profitable**
- **When running just one horse in the day he has made a small 7% ROI**
- **Horses priced between 14/1 and 40/1 LTO have produced a healthy 21% ROI**
- **When booking a jockey with a career SR of 14%+ to ride a horse for the first time (not debut) - 18 wins from 90 (SR 20%) for a profit of £16.79 (ROI +18.7%)**
- **Horses off the track for 6 months or more have provided 20 winners from 84 (SR 23.8%) for a profit of £78.87 (ROI +93.9%)**

Comments On This Sample Document

The full report contains research into fifty of the top flat turf trainers in the uk.

So no all weather races are considered .. just flat racing on grass.

The flat season starts at the very end of March 2014 and all data is up to date for that point in time.

Looking at this sample trainer (T D Barron) you can quickly see in the data above some sweet spots.

He has a very good record with favourites as judged by the strike rate, net profit and ROI %

Catching my personal eye as well is his record with horses laid up off the track for 100 days or more.

Note as well how terrible his record during the month of July is.

Backing him in July is a pot hole for your cash you are now better placed to side step.

Bear in mind that any profit figures above are based on starting price.

In real life any semi competent backing punter should be able to beat starting price returns

by using [betting exchanges](#) of early prices from [Best Odds Guaranteed Bookmakers](#)

If you are a layer not a backer well you of course need to think less real life profit than quoted as opposed to more.

So there you go a quick sample of the sort of data you can expect in the full report.

You are now armed with a lot of data bout T D Barron that can help you better assess his runners over the flat season to come. You also have a few highlights you could even create a micro system or two on for his runners.

With the full report you get similar but for fifty top flat trainers so your knowledge will be expanded further.
